Dear Parents,

SITE ISSUES

In line with the ban on smoking in public places, the Oaklands schools have successfully operated a no-smoking policy since 2009. As well as the obvious health benefits, it is also about giving children the right messages regarding smoking. With this in mind and advice from WBC, both governing bodies feel very strongly that being seen to smoke is not helpful in this instance, and as such ask that all parents and visitors to the site do not 'smoke' ecigarettes or anything similar. The schools' no-smoking policy will be reviewed to reflect this. Thank you for your co-operation.

We will be carrying out major repairs to the school field in the spring term. This project is totally dependent on weather conditions but we are hoping we will have a lovely new field for Sports Day 2014. Sport is very important to the school and I know the staff will find

ways of continuing to offer the wide range of sporting activities during this period. We will keep you posted as and when we have any news to report.

In my last letter I asked if you would ensure that your children (including toddlers) do not 'scoot' on school premises. I would also ask that, for safety, when parking scooters and bikes you go around the back of the terrapin building and do not walk across the back of the little car park at the side of the terrapin.

PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE

Thank you to those of you who completed the questionnaire online or returned a paper copy via the school post box. Although this allows for anonymity and is extremely useful in helping us to address and plan whole school and year group teaching it does not allow us to address individual issues. My door is always open if you have a problem you wish to discuss and the class teachers are happy to make time for you after school, meetings and training etc permitting.

THE LIFE WEBSITE

Although the website is up and running and we trust, very informative the staff and pupils have been very frustrated by the new 'LIFE' learning platform from Uniservity. The fact that we have not yet been able to provide logins for parents is also a concern. We have had a number of discussions with the service provider and WBC expressing our dissatisfaction with the service. We are still pursuing a number of issues and will advise you of progress.

THE LIFE BUS

Once again the children enjoyed the experience of the Life Bus which is a PSHE resource that has visited our school for the past few years. I hope you took the opportunity to pop into the bus to see what the children will be doing in it. We ask for voluntary contributions for trips and visits as we do not have the funds for these additional activities. This year we only received contributions amounting to 65% of the total required.

I appreciate times are hard for all of us but unfortunately the school cannot afford to increase its contribution towards such events and we will have to consider very carefully whether we offer this again.

If your child is entitled to a Free School Meal then the cost of such activities is covered by Pupil Premium, which the school receives from Wokingham Borough Council. If you think you are entitled to this please contact the school office.

SPORT

Football League: Oaklands v St Michael's, Thursday 14th November 2013.

The A team's successful run finally came to an end at St Michael's Sandhurst. Despite taking the lead and having plenty of possession the boys could not hold onto it and soon found themselves level and then behind. Attack after attack fizzled out and in spite of some good goal keeping, we were just not able to crack their defences and lost the game 2-1. The B team found themselves 2-0 down at half time but instead of being disheartened they rallied round in the second half and soon pulled one goal back. Five minutes later they got a deserved equaliser and then went on to score another goal eventually winning the game 3-2. It was a fabulous result and their first victory of the season.

Sportshall Athletics: Monday 18th November 2013

Both year 3/4 and 5/6 teams qualified for the Wokingham schools event held at Bulmershe sports centre. Years 3 and 4 went on first to compete against three other schools at various running relays, throwing and jumping events. In a closely fought competition in which they showed real determination finishing third overall but only 4 points off second and 12 points off first. It was a great effort and well done to all. They fully deserved their bronze medals.

The year 5 and 6 team were up against six other schools which included some giants of athletics in the shape of St Pauls, Aldryngton and Earley St Peters. With a stunning display of speed, skill and strength, we dominated most of the events and came out on top in first place with gold medals all round. As a reward the team can now look forward to the Berkshire Games competition in April and who knows, maybe a national competition if they are successful there!

Congratulations to all competitors in what promises to be a very good season for us in athletics.
