In exchange for not wearing uniform on the **13th June**, your child is asked to bring the following into school:

#### Jars of Sweets

Jars should be jam/sauce jar size and should be filled with a selection of wrapped fruit sweets, chocolate or chewy sweets & lollies (no pickles please!). We also ask that the contents are clearly visible and the jars are <u>NOT</u> wrapped in paper as we need to be able to see the contents. So start recycling your old cooking sauce & jam jars etc. wash them out and put them by ready to fill with sweets.
