Sports Update

It has been a very busy few weeks for sports at Oaklands Junior, with at least one event taking place every week. It was a noisy coach trip home!

"Working with animals" Event

Six of our Year 6 pupils who had expressed an interest in working with animals as a career spent an exciting day at Bayer plc in Reading on Tuesday. With the help of very patient puppy Bella, they learned how to listen to a dog's pulse with a stethoscope; they bandaged stuffed animals; examined tics and fleas under the microscope; looked at live lungworms in test tubes; compared bones from different animals; saw the skull of a horse; looked inside a tortoise's body; compared different animal hearts. They were even provided with a delicious lunch and given a "goody bag" each to take home. "Inspirational" was their view of the day!
