Sky Studios and Visitors in school

On Thursday 17th October, a group of year 5 children visited Sky Studios in London to make a news report about Space. Prior to the trip, they were sorted in to 4 teams, chose their roles and decided on a topic: Should billions of pounds be spent on Space travel? Once they arrived at Sky, the children split off in to their studio groups and began writing their scripts, deciding on back drops and choosing costumes. They then rehearsed and received feedback from the producers and directors. Once they were happy with the footage, which had been filmed by the camera operator, the editing team selected and cropped the clips. Finally, the footage was pulled together to make an exciting and informative news report. What an inspiring and enjoyable day out!
