Pupil Premium funding—What is it for?

The pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England.

It is designed to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities perform better, and close the gap between them and their peers.

The school receives an allocation of funding per head but this does not mean an individual entitlement: the school has discretion to spend this money to close the gap in the most effective way.

Funding for the Financial Year 2019-2020

In the 2019 to 2020 financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each pupil registered as eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years:

£1,320 for pupils in reception to year 6

Schools will receive £2,300 for any pupil:

- identified in the January 2018 school census, or the alternative provision census, as having left local authority care as a result of:
 - adoption
 - · a special guardianship order
 - a child arrangements order (previously known as a residence order)
- who has been in local authority care for 1 day or more
- recorded as both eligible for FSM in the last 6 years and as being looked after (or as having left local authority care)

How Oaklands Junior's will use this funding?

When your child starts at Oaklands, you will be asked to attend a meeting with Mr Holland and Mrs Lenon to discuss your child. During the meeting, we will talk about academic support and your child's interests in and out of school. This will help us to identify where your child needs support.

We will also chat with your child to ask them about their interests and aspirations. Periodically, the whole school are asked to fill in a questionnaire about their interests both in and out of school and this information will be used to keep us up to date with your child's interests.

Funding will always be used primarily for academic interventions including booster groups, one to one support sessions, homework club and nurture sessions. However, it may also be used for the following:

- School Trips—this includes all day trips and partial funding for the residential trips in Year 4 and Year 6.
 We do ask you to pay the first £20 for the Year 4 trip and £50 for the Year 6 trip; we can then use pupil premium funds to cover the balance.
- Activities in and out of school
- Music lessons
- School uniform—we will fund up to £25 per year for Uniform if required. For secondary uniform we will fund one of each compulsory uniform item
