Now that national and local results are available, we are very pleased to share with you our SATs results from Summer 2019 (attached to this letter). Oaklands provides termly data for the Corvus Trust with attainment tracked in Year 6 and reported to the Trustees' meetings throughout the year.

SATs results provide just a snapshot of a week of government tests on which every school is judged. We place far greater value, as a school, on what our children achieve throughout the year; this includes their work across a range of curriculum subjects and their own personal development both emotionally and socially – so important for life. There are only a few times in life when, if you do not succeed, you are unable to try again but KS2 SATs is one such time. I feel very strongly about this as there are so many things that happen in children's lives that may affect them, including health which cannot be guaranteed for a particular day or week in May! However, we value the whole child and we will always do our very best for each and every child in this school throughout the year, helping them gain the confidence to succeed.

We are a unique school in Wokingham, in that we are a Thinking School, something that we have always valued across the curriculum, with our vision of our Oaklands Mindset, teaching important skills for life – ambition, challenge, independence, communication, friendship and enjoyment.
