#### **Craft Sessions at The Cowshed**

We are a Berkshire based charity providing support to people of all backgrounds in a time of personal crisis. Our aim is to provide good quality, cleaned and ironed clothes, new underwear and toiletries, bedding, curtains and other essential items free to anyone in need. We work with over 200 other organisations and the people we support are referred to us by social services, charities, churches, schools, doctors/health professionals to name just a few. We also have a craft community of volunteers who support the charity by making our referral bags (in which we pack the items) along with many other items which we use within our work and to raise funds.

My reason for writing to let you know that we are holding **craft sessions for primary school aged children** (adult supervision required) at our Hurst office throughout the school summer holidays. The 2 hour sessions run every Tuesday from 29<sup>th</sup> July until 24<sup>th</sup> August with morning and afternoon sessions available. Each week we will be offering a different craft activity, giving the children the opportunity to try out scrap book making, card making, bunting decorating, button pictures and t-shirt decorating. There is a small charge of £5 per person and everything the children make they can take home with them.

If you think that this is something which may be of interest to your school, I would be very grateful if you could pass on the information to parents. As a charity, we are always trying to find new ways to engage the local community and this is a lovely way to share our passion for recycling and craft.

### Summer Holiday Touch Rugby Acting Up!



#### **Autumn Term 2021 Reminder**

Children return to school on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September and we then have two days to settle the children back into our routines, which will be perfect before the first full week of school. We have realised that many of our children joined us in times which were not normal, so have not seen a crowded playground at the start of the school day and this may be a little daunting for them, especially following the lengthy social distancing we have all experienced and children can also be a little anxious on a return after the long summer holiday. We would therefore like to ease the children back in with a 'soft' start as follows and we would be very grateful for your support in this:

### Years 4, 5, and 6:

Arrive from 8.30am to 8.45am and go straight to their classrooms, where fire exits will be open and teachers will be present to greet them. We would ask you to please allow your child to make their own way from the school gate independently to their classroom, so that we can quickly get them settled in classes before Year 3s arrive. Class names will be on the outside doors so they won't get lost in the first two days. At the end of the day, please do come on to site and wait in the junior playground, where your children will find you at the end of the day at 3.20pm.



#### Year 3

Arrive with a Parent/Carer from 8.50am to 9.00am to walk the route to the playground and

see where to wait together. Our Y3 team will then meet you on the playground. This will hopefully be a less stressful and quieter, more relaxed return for our youngest pupils.

If you are dropping a child at the Infant School in the morning, you may send Junior children directly to their classrooms (or playground for Year 3), from the Infant playground, at the times detailed above for their year group.

From the following Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September in our first full week, we will be aiming to return to a 'normal' school day from that Monday, with all children and parents arriving on site at the start and end of the day. We have missed you all so much and cannot wait to see you back on the playground. Staff will also return to being on the playground with you at the beginning and end of the day. Once we have settled back into our routines, year group teams will I am sure be seeking help with reading and other activities which has been very much missed.
