## Thames Valley Autism Alert card

The Berkshire Autism Alert Card has been rebranded to become the Thames Valley Autism Alert Card, expanding the scheme to Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire.

The alert card provides a simple way for autistic people of all ages and their parents or carers to explain the condition quickly and easily to others, or get assistance, giving cardholders and their families more confidence to go out and about. Cardholders (or those applying on their behalf, such as a parent, carer or social worker) can choose to share some additional information about how autism affects them, and any particular support needs that they have, with Thames Valley Police, which officers can access if they are shown an alert card to help provide appropriate support.
