Dear Parents & Carers,

As we reach the end of January and reflect on this term, we have very much enjoyed having the whole school back together again, not only for breaks, lunches and assemblies but also to be able to do so much more with our curriculum in the way of support and interventions. When we lock down into separate year groups and rotas, it is all hands on deck with staff covering many extra duties and rotas, leaving little free time for anything other than comfort breaks and lunch. I am very grateful to all my staff for the extra support that has been needed and willingly given, but also very thankful that staff have remained in good health throughout this half term. I have everything crossed that this will continue, as it is only for this reason that we have managed to keep going with the rising number of Covid cases in school.

We are not unique with rising numbers, as we have been made aware that Wokingham hit a record number of 700 across all primary schools this week for pupils/staff; with similar rising numbers experienced nationally. Wokingham and Public Health meet online with schools weekly, sharing the latest government guidance and safety measures, which we regularly pass on to you with Wokingham flyers – we hope you find these useful.

We, as a school, are continuing with all our hygiene/safety measures and although there is no need to wear face masks, we would advise all visitors/parents to continue to wear these in school - staff are also continuing to wear these as a personal choice, as we do have concerns about the rising number of cases in school and we want everyone to reach half-term safely, to be able to enjoy it. Please continue to test your children daily before attending school; staff will also be testing daily.

Lateral Flow Test Kits

Thank you for your support in our recent request that all children have a daily lateral flow test before attending school – **we do need everyone to take part in this for it to be effective**; in this way we can hope to minimise the spread and keep everyone safe. Unfortunately, as a school, we only have enough test kits for staff as we are not supplied with any extra for children, nor can we order any. Secondary schools do give out kits for students, as they are all expected to test twice weekly. We know that this is difficult for some families obtaining test kits, so we hope the information shared below helps you with where local supplies can be picked up.
