These experiences can have a profound and negative impact on our children's emotional, social, and cognitive development.

At Oaklands Junior School, we prioritize the safety and wellbeing of our children. We strive to create a safe and supportive learning environment where children can thrive.

To help mitigate these risks, we encourage you to:

- Openly discuss online safety with your children. Talk to them about what they are accessing online, the dangers they may encounter, and the importance of critical thinking.
- Monitor your child's online activity. Be aware of the websites they visit, the apps they use, and the content they are exposed to.
- **Use parental controls.** Utilize the settings on your devices and internet service to restrict access to inappropriate content.
- **Be mindful of the music your children listen to.** Discuss the lyrics of songs with your children and help them understand the messages they convey.
- **Lead by example.** Model responsible online behaviour and demonstrate healthy media consumption habits.
