Important Year

- Last year at primary school
- Transition year – preparation for secondary school
- A time to “grow” and blossom! Independence encouraged from the outset.

Children's dress code

- Children are expected to arrive at school each day smartly and appropriately dressed in school uniform with shirts tucked in at all times. Shorts may be worn during break times. Short skirts are not accepted.
- Children come to school on PE/Games days dressed in their PE kits. Kit is yellow or blue Oaklands t-shirt and navy shorts. Generally children are bare foot for PE in the hall but have trainers for outdoor games lessons and for walking to and from the hall. Tracksuits may be worn outside for games in cold weather. In the last half term, children will bring PE kits in to practise for secondary school.
- If children have pierced ears only small studs should be worn, but these must be removed or covered for PE lessons. No other jewellery except watches may be worn but these must be removed for PE. Also, long hair must be tied back for safety reasons. This applies to both boys and girls.

Maths

Times Table practice tests will be every other Tuesday, with mental strategies on alternating weeks.

We begin with place value and calculations (4 operations). We then move on to fractions later in the Autumn term.

English

English topics will often be focused around a book or text. We start with The Watertower picture book.

- Homework task will be set weekly on Teams.
 - Spelling activity from grid handed out each Thursday, due in the following Tuesday.
 - Regular reading (5x per week minimum expectation)
